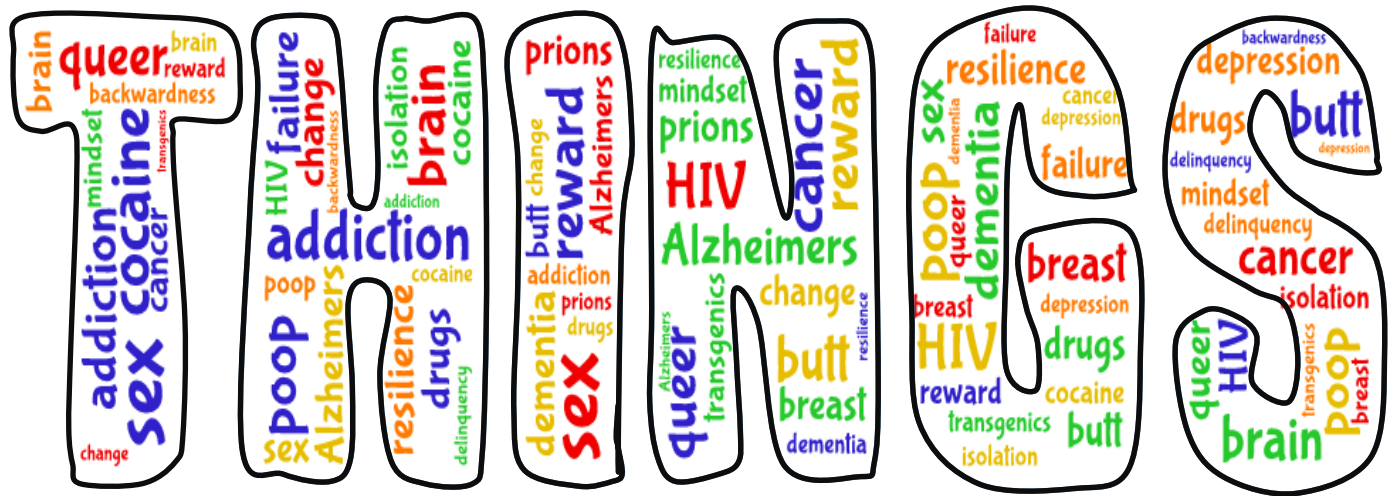

Addressing Stigmas Through Research

What do poop, drug addiction, Alzheimer's, dementia, breast cancer, sexuality, and depression have in common?



This course uses an interdisciplinary perspective (drawing from neuroscience, anthropology, pathology, psychology, gender studies and visual studies) to explore the science behind the stigmatized topics listed above. As a **W** course, students will approach the science of stigma by proposing a research project into a topic stigmatized in society. The writing component of the course will emphasize the composition of a persuasive and effective grant proposal and research statement, building skills for both academic and professional research.
